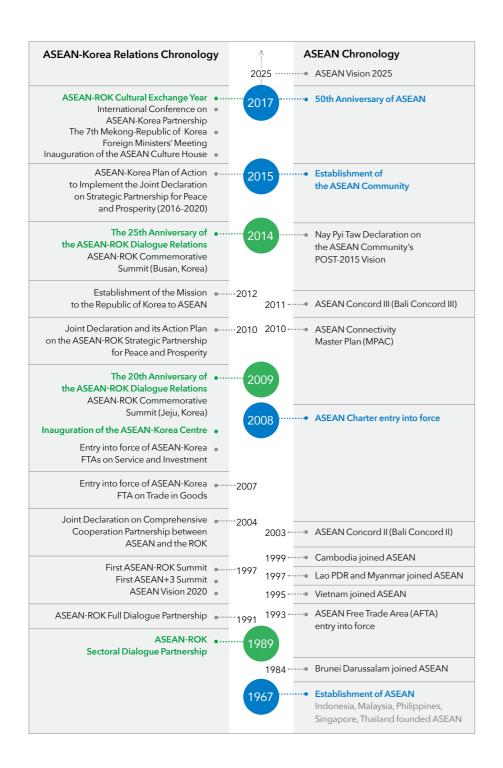

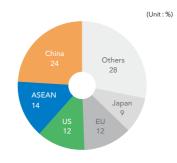

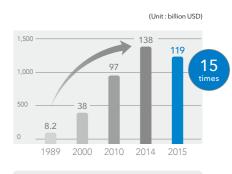
ASEAN-KOREA RELATIONS IN KEY FIGURES (2015)

Major Trading Partners of Korea



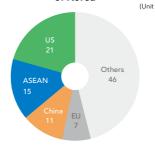

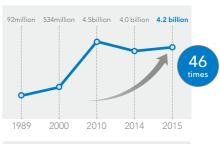
Foreign Investment Destination of Korea



ASEAN is Korea's **2nd** largest investment destination

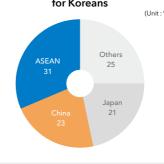
FDI from Korea to ASEAN

International Travel Destination for Koreans

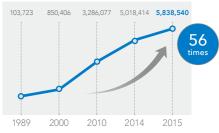

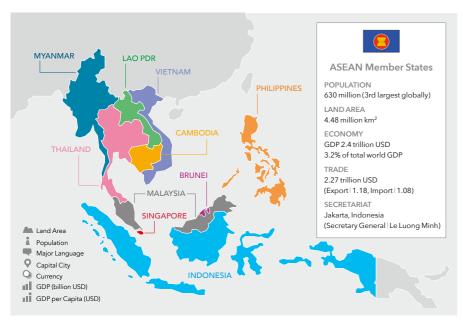
